Alabama Severe Weather Information for 2002

I talked to Mr. Brian Peters, who is with the National Weather Service, Birmingham, Al.

Brian is the Warning Coordination Meteorologist for the Birmingham office.

He also has given us many great and informative classes in the area for recognizing and reporting severe weather conditions to the SkyWarn nets in the area. I think I understood that there will be a class in the Phenix City area in the Edition no 135

near future. I'll have to check on the schedule for that class and pass it on to everyone. I do encourage everyone to attend whether you've been to one of them before or not. They are always informative and interesting to everyone. Everyone who attends these training sessions receives a nice certificate from the National Weather Service.

I picked up a Weather Safety folder at the NWS table and it has a lot of information about tornadoes and how to preparing for severe weather situations before they occur.

Also listed are the frequencies for the NWS weather radio stations around the state. The Columbus station is on 162.400 and the Auburn station is on 162.525. So if you have a scanner, put these frequencies in memory so you can check on the weather at any time. If you don't have a scanner, there are many models available and your local Radio Shack has several of them. If you watch, you can usually get one on a pretty good reduction in price. Many of them have a button that will take you instantly to the NWS frequencies with changing any settings on the radio. Be sure to get one that can be battery powered so if you lose power, you can still hear not only the weather but the local Ham Radio nets as well during

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emergency conditions around where you live.

I think I'll suggest that our club (CARC) purchase a scanner for raffle to be given away at the Christmas dinner and maybe we can put a few bucks in the club change box.

There will be a Christmas Dinner party this year. I'm not sure of date, time, or location. I will forward that information if I receive it from the club. I'm sure it will be announced on the Wed night nets. It should be regular club night and Chef Lee's. but check net for details.

Back to WEATHER INFORMATION. The fall winter storm season is on us and while we've been pretty lucky for a while, we must be ready for severe conditions at any time. There was a tornadoe last week at Abbeville Alabama which is just below Eufaula. It's about 65 or 70 miles south of us. There was considerable damage and I think two deaths. Brian said this was a category 2 tornadoe.

This looked like a very dangerous WALL CLOUD that formed over downtown Columbus as I watched from Kmart parking lot in Phenix City. Believe me, I didn't take my eyes off of it until it was gone. I was ready to put it on the radio if it looked if it was going to get any lower or if I saw any rotation. Strangely there was no rotation of this cloud or any around it so I just watched it for a while.
