1999/2000 Boys 13 Fairfax County Champions

March 11, 2000 - The Vienna Warhawks 13 Year Old Boys County Select Team put the finishing touches on an undefeated season by beating McLean 64-34 in the Championship Game of the Fairfax County Youth Basketball Tournament at Yorktown High School. Vienna, which also won the regular season title, ended the season with a perfect record of 24-0.

The Warhawks opened up in a full court press to set the tempo of the game. Vienna took an early lead, but the game remained close. Vienna had a late surge of offense to take a 31-20 half time lead.

In the second half, McLean made a run to cut the lead to eight points with 10 minutes remaining. After a quick time out, the Warhawks stepped it up a level, on both offense and defense, to put the game out of reach for good. Vienna held McLean to only 14 points in the second half. **Brent Locey**, the Tournament MVP, led Vienna with 23 points and 15 rebounds. **Derek Feussner**, who also had an excellent tournament, had 12 points and 4 steals.

Kwame Safo has done an excellent job of orchestrating the offense from the point guard position, leading the team in assists and in three-point shooting percentage. Brian Landry, Stuart Rawlinson, Brock Boone and Scott Harootyan have made solid contributions on offense and defense throughout the season.

The Warhawks successfully defended their tournament title from last year. In fact, this Vienna boy's age group has won a County Championship every year since 1997 when they started in the league as 10 year olds. "This is a great group of young men," coach Leggett said.
