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Ed. DIRECTIONS TO THE JANUARY BASH @ KUNDANG LAKES - 9.30 a.m., 4 February 2001

From KL, head North on the North-South Expressway. Exit at Sungai Buloh. Turn left immediately after toll, towards Kuala Selangor (route 54). Set tripmeter to zero at next traffic lights. Take right turn at 6.9km. Turn left at 9.5km immediately after BP station (on your left), onto a small country road giving a passable imitation of being a Paris-Dakar stage. At 11.1 km turn left onto a small road after passing under some high-tension cables overhead. At 11.4km turn left again. Follow the edge of the lake until you see the haremobile, a dusty dark grey Land Rover WEG 7566.

Kiara GP 2001 – 14 January 2001

The first race in the Kiara GP 2001 was held on 14 January 2001 with 32 riders taking part. The time trial through Bukit Kiara was flagged off from Devi's Corner in Desa Sri Hartamas and wound its way through the singletrack of Bukit Kiara to end at Soul'ed Out.

Conditions were treacherous as the rain of the previous month had exposed many roots on the descents and turned parts of the trail into a quagmire.

The rush to beat the clock and Pigpen "King of Kiara" Pat's record of 1.01:48 (set in similar conditions) yielded several minor flesh wounds, some soft tissue damage and numerous broken bike parts. When all the blood and mud was hosed off, Pigpen's official record still stood although Tom "The Fonze" de Bruyne (1st; 1.01:50; recently recovered from 5 broken ribs suffered on a secret Kiara training ride) and "Big" Ben Thomas (2nd; 1.02:12; cool Jeep Cherokee) came close to matching it.

Slightly more information on the race can be gleaned from the text of my e-mail to the King himself, Pat "Pigpen" Brunsdon:-

Pat,

Behold, the answers to your queries are at hand!

32 riders took part in the TT. I didn't partake and instead manned the start and finish lines. The competition was brutal with Tom de Bruyne gunning for first place on the back of his recent recovery from 5 broken ribs and a fractured wrist, Ben Thomas keen on beating him, last TT winner Jessen, Joe, Adli and Farizul all looking good as contenders.

In the end, the sloppy conditions, akin to what you set your record in, racked up many victims both mortal and inanimate (Caution: leave cyclocomputers on road bikes. They have no place on mountain bikes, especially in Kiara).

Your record did not fall but Tom came very close with a 1.01:50 (he claims an unofficial record of 52m). Ben was second with 1.02:12. Both of them looked real strong going out and through the checkpoints from what I understand. After that my memory fails me about the Open placings. Joe will tell you all about his ride separately, I'm sure. Hans won the Masters class with a 1.16:something, making it 3-0 with Boon Foo, while Cassandra came in at 1.22:something, putting many of the so-called Open class **macho men** to shame.
