Chairman's Chat

Before looking forward to 2002, I would like to reflect back at some of our achievements last year.

The National Speedo League Finals in April found us finishing 3rd in the 'B' Final, rewarding us with a ranking as one of the top Swimming Clubs in the UK. A couple of months later at the Welsh Age Group Championships in Swansea, our swimmers performed exceptionally well once again and by winning over twice as many gold medals as the nearest best Club, we maintained our position as Top Swimming Club in Wales. This was reinforced further later in the year at the Welsh Winter Championships in December, where our final medal tally once again out-numbered all other Welsh Clubs.

Apart from their invaluable contribution to our overall Club performance during the year, our individual swimming achievements were equally as impressive. Superb coaching by our professional and volunteer staff resulted in 16 of our swimmers achieving qualifying times for the National Age Group Championships and representation at the highest level in national and international events rounded an impressive 2001 for the City of Cardiff Swimming Club.

With qualification to another Speedo League Final, numerous Open Meets, Inter-Clubs, Championships of one category or another and not forgetting of course, the Commonwealth Games, there is so much to look forward to in 2002. Many of our senior swimmers have qualified for the Commonwealth Games Trials and I am especially looking forward to following their progress up to and after these trials.

Indeed, it is this ever-improving success of our Club, that we have received interest and movement from swimmers of other clubs in recent months, all wanting to share and improve our depth of ability further. I am delighted that we have a Club that welcomes all from within and outside the County borders and may we always be able to embrace all those that wish to develop further in this great sport of swimming.

The only uncertainty on the horizon still is the future of the pool in WIS. We decided at the outset to maintain a low public profile stance in our discussions and correspondence with the Sports Council for Wales, Cardiff County Council, National Assembly for Wales and our governing body WASA. Needless to say, that all our deliberations have the very best interest for our Club. We believe that it is this method of approach that will result in achieving our aim of maintaining the WIS facility until our longer-term objective of a 50-metre facility in Cardiff is achieved. We believe that it is by adopting such a professional, but determined stance that has led to the Sports Council for Wales to issue their latest statement;

"SCW would not close the pool at the Institute until the new National Swimming Pool becomes operational." Furthermore, we have been advised that;

"The SCW is currently in discussions with Cardiff County Council about including the provision of a new pool for the City in building a new swimming pool in Cardiff."

With statements coming from such a high authority, we are cautiously optimistic about the future of our facilities, but we will nevertheless continue to pursue all lines of communication available to us until we achieve our objective.

The gala organisers, to their credit, gave us the whole pool and our entire team warmed up across all 6 lanes (Nikki says she may try this tactic at all our galas from now on!). From the start of the meet,, the Cardiff swimmers swam with great enthusiasm and commitment, with nearly all of them clocking up personal bests in their individual events. There were 1st places for Owen Thomas (10/U Breaststroke & 10/U Backstroke), Josh Carbis (11/U Freestyle), Amy Locke (9/U Breaststroke), Victoria Srivastava (9/U Freestyle), Sean Cronin (10/U Butterfly), Chelsea Mellin (9/U Butterfly) & Ieauan Lloyd (9/U Butterfly) but probably the most satisfying results were the consistent 1st places in the relays, proving the depth of talent that our club contains.

Several of the swimmers in the 11 years age group were forced to pull out at short notice due to illness which meant that there were quite a few of our team that had to 'swim up' an age group which they all did admirably.

Cardiff lead the competition right from the start and were ahead right to the final relays when 2 disqualifications handed the lead over to Hereford who ended up winning by a mere 3 points, with a large gap back to 3rd place Bridgend.

A special mention should go to Kerry Vokes, who was on poolside duty for the 1st time and managed to marshall all of the children despite the team changing, as the gala progressed, to accommodate the missing swimmers. The look of relief on her face at the end of the canon was a joy to behold!

Behind The Scenes

This issue, a report on FINA Drug Control

Were you aware that all competitive swimmers, irrespective of age, are governed by the ASFGB and FINADoping Protocols?

Those of us who have signed a Welsh Amateur Swimming Association entry form authorising our children to be dope tested never really consider it an issue that will involve us Do we? Should we? After all most of us think of sports dope testing as the search for Steroids

However the answer to both these questions is - - Yes, we must consider it.

The reason - would you want your child to be involved in an innocent test failure through your ignorance? Leading to a possible ban?

I will ignore in this note Narcotics, Anabolic Steroids, Diuretics, Peptide Hormones, Mimetics Analogues and Blood doping and mention two main areas that could affect the "innocent" swimmer. However it must be stressed that ignorance would not be a defence if a positive test occurs.

Asthma

There are many Children in modern society who need to take Asthma medication. FINA allows only certain types of reliever to be used by competitors.

The drugs commonly used can be divided as follows

The **Allowed** Asthma Drugs

Sodium cromoglycate
Theophyline
Beclomethasone (by inhalation only)
Fluticasone (by inhalation only)
Salbutamol **

Terbutaline **
Salmeterol **

The **Banned** asthma drugs

Ephedrine Isoprenaline Fenoterol Rimiterol Orciprenaline

** These three drugs are PERMITTED BY INHALER ONLY and written notification is required to be made to the governing body (WASA)

Common Ailments such as Cold/cough, Diarrhoea, Hayfever, Pain and Vomiting

The common sense question you should ask is should the swimmers really be swimming if they are suffering from Diarrhoea, vomiting etc?

However, that aside, you should not take any of the banned drugs of which the following are examples only. The reason is that a lot of them are classed as stimulants

Cold / Cough / Hayfever Banned drugs :ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, phenylpropanolamine , Phenylephrine

Diarrhoea / Pain Banned drugs : opioids (eg morphine) caffeine

So what do we do if "Junior " has a cold - Read the packet before administering anything — *LEMSIP* contains caffeine and phenylephrine !!!!!

This article is not intended to be and is not exhaustive and lists only a few of the many drugs banned. It is merely an attempt to make our swimmers aware of the issues concerned.
