Pro Life News

Pro-choice politicians are choosing to ignore news that scientists have been able to successfully manipulate stemcells found in amniotic fluid and that they have similar potential to embryonic stemcells may affect the Congressional debate on a bill to force taxpayers to fund embryonic stemcell research. "They grow fast, as fast as embryonic stem cells, and they show great pluripotentiality," meaning they can become many kinds of tissues, said study leader Anthony Atala, director of the Institute for Regenerative Medicine at Wake Forest University School of Medicine in Winston Salem, N.C. "But they remain stable for years without forming tumors," he added, something that embryonic cells are not very good at. Rep. Diana DeGette says she doesn't expect news on the amniotic stem cells to cause supporters of the funding bill to change their minds. "We won't lose anyone who was going to support the bill," she told the Associated Press. "People who would have already opposed the (embryonic) stem cell bill

will use this breakthrough as an excuse to vote no."

And people who are in favor of embryonic stemcell research will ignore this breakthrough that shows more promise and does not harm human embryos.
