## 1 General Information

The Thorlabs LED spot UV curing system is designed for curing (hardening) of certain inks, coatings, and adhesives which are formulated with photoinitiators and resins. When exposed to the correct energy and irradiance in the required band of UV light, polymerization occurs, and so the adhesives harden or cure. Usually, this reaction is very quick, a matter of a few seconds. This can be advantageous for any application that requires critical alignment or exact positioning.

Applications include glass and plastic bonding, optical fiber coatings and coating of flooring.

## 1.1 Safety

## 1.3 Requirements

The CS2010 software is compatible with the following operating systems:

- Windows ® XP (32-bit) SP3
- Windows ® Vista (32-bit, 64-bit)
- Windows ® 7 (32-bit, 64-bit)

For operation of the CS2010, also an NI-VISA (version 5.0.2 or higher) is required. This NI-VISA engines comes with the Thorlabs CS2010 installation CD, but can be downloaded also from National Instruments' website <a href="https://www.ni.com">www.ni.com</a>.

## 2 Installation

## 2.1 Parts List

Inspect the shipping container for damage.

If the shipping container seems to be damaged, keep it until you have inspected the contents and you have inspected the CS2010 mechanically and electrically.

Verify that you have received the following items within the package:

- 1. CS2010 driver
- 2. Wide range power supply (24V DC 1.5A) and power cord
- 3. CS2010 handset with CS20A2 Collimation Adapter and holder
- 4. Manual
- 5. Quick Start
- 6. CD with driver software
- 7. USB 2.0 cable

## 2.2 Getting Started

#### Note

Take care for air ventilation in order to avoid overheating of the driver. Please pay attention to the safety recommendations and the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations applying to your workplace.

- Connect the hand set to the driver (jack "LED" (2) on the rear panel)
- Connect the power supply to mains outlet, using the supplied power cord
- Connect the DC output of the power supply to the jack "24VDC 1.5A" (5) at the rear panel
- Switch on the driver, using the switch (1) at the rear panel.

## 2.3 Operating Elements

- 12 LED ON/OFF switch on handset
- 13 Hand set holder

Warning Do NOT look into the output! Do NOT direct the UV emission onto skin!

## 2.4 Rear Panel



- 1 Power switch
- 2 LED output (connector for hand set)
- 3 3.5mm jacket for foot switch
- 4 USB 2.0 connector (remote computer)
- 5 DC input
- 6 Serial number

## 3 Operating Instruction

After startup screen, the display (1) shows the last used Operation Mode.

#### ESC button (3)

Leave the current active menu and return to the previously chosen menu or to Main Menu.

#### OK button (4)

Used to enter a submenu or to confirm setting / exit submenu


#### LED button (5)

Use switch LED or the button (12) in the hand set to switch ON/OFF the UV LED.

#### Rotary knob (2)

Used for scrolling through a menu, adjusting numeric values and selecting parameters


#### Main Menu





When in an operation mode, push ESC or OK button to enter Main menu. In the main menu, use OK button to enter the highlighted menu item and ESC to leave it. Below please find a brief explanation of the menu items.

## 3.1 Settings





Use rotary knob to choose a menu item and press **OK** to enter

**Brightness** sets the display brightness in %

**Safety Mode** When OFF the LED can be switched on at any time, when ON - only while

displaying an operation mode.

**Beep Interval** During LED on, a beep can be enabled. The beep interval can be set

between Off and 99sec.

**Beep Volume** Low, Mid and High

Intensity Unit LED intensity can be set in mA, % (of the limit current) and mW/cm<sup>2</sup>

(irradiance). This intensity unit will be displayed in all operation modes.

Power Mode In Continuous Mode, this changes the function of the LED ON/OFF

switches (5) and (12) between "Toggle" (push to switch on, push again to switch off) and "Hold" (the LED emits UV light only as long as the button is


pushed).

### 3.2 Continuous Mode



Adjust LED current and switch on/off the LED manually. The bottom line displays the wavelength of the LED. LED intensity can be adjusted using the rotary knob while LED is on or off. The "Max" LED intensity is equal to the <u>set user limit</u>.


## 3.3 Timer Mode



Adjust desired intensity and exposure time. LED button (5) and (12) switches on the LED and start the timer count down. The remaining time will be displayed:




## 3.4 Configuration Mode



Up to 10 different preconfigured timer mode sets for intensity and exposure time can be programmed. Each **Config** can renamed; max. length - 12 characters.

#### Example:

- Choose a configuration set and press OK button (4). A submenu comes up an highlights the name of the selected configuration set:



Press OK to enter edit mode:




- Use the rotary knob to select a number, a character, the underscore or the backspace (delete) ■ button. When the desired set name is completed, select "Done" to confirm and return to the previous menu:




- Set the desired values for intensity and exposure time. Therefore, select the appropriate line using rotary knob (2), press OK to enter edit mode and change the set value using rotary knob. When done, press OK.




- Press ESC to return to the overview of all configurations:



- To use a Configuration, select it and press OK button - the name and settings will appear.



By pushing the LED button on the controller or on the hand set, the LED switches on and the countdown timer starts, emitting a beep according to the set interval:



## 3.5 Slope Mode

In this mode, the LED intensity can changed during exposure. Entering this mode, exposure time, start intensity and end intensity can be set.



Pushing LED button executes the ramp and the timer counter appears, emitting a beep according to the set interval.




### 3.6 Irradiance Mode


This mode allows to compensate ageing effects of the LED. As a result of long term operation the efficiency of the UV LED decreases, i.e., the UV power drops though the current is the same. As a result, the exposure of the probe (adhesive, coating etc.), which is the product of UV power and exposure time, drops and this way the curing process may not be completed. To compensate that, the power degradation can be measured and exposure time extended accordingly. This way the exposure remains constant, ensuring best curing results.

#### **Procedure**

- Select Irradiance Mode from Main Menu. The submenu appears showing a Reference irradiance value. This value is originated from the last executed power density adjustment.
- Move the slider (6) on top of the controller to the left position, this way opening the power measurement aperture (7)
- Remove the optics (CS20A2 Collimation Adapter or CS20A3 Focusing Adapter) from the handset and place the LED output (10) of the handset firmly into the aperture (7)
- Choose "Start Measurement" and push OK button (4).




A "Measured" Value will be displayed.



Choose "Readjust" and push OK button (4).



The measured value will be displayed now as the new reference. Additionally, exposure time will be recalculated and corrected. This applies to all stored exposure time values in Timer Mode, Slope Mode and pre-configurations:



### Note

The measured value corresponds to the irradiance in an 8mm distance from the LED without optics (equal to 5mm from the front of the handset).

## 3.7 User Limit

The absolute LED limit current is programmed to the EEPROM in the handset and read out at power up. Any lower limit can be set.



Note: If the intensity value is set to %, 100% always refers to the LED current limit as set.

## 4 Computer Interface

The CS2010 curing system can be remotely controlled by a PC via USB interface. The control software is included with the attached CD. After installation of the software, the CS2010 can be connected to the computer using the attached USB cable.

## 4.1 Software Installation

#### Attention

Install the software prior to connect the CS2010 to your computer! CS2010 Application Software requires a NI VISA Engine installed in advance.

Below, the installation procedure to a Windows7<sup>©</sup> (32 bit) operating system is illustrated. Insert the installation CD into your disk drive. Depending on your operating system settings, the startup screen should appear - if not, please start the installation by executing

[CD drive]:\Autorun\Autorun.exe.


As a first step, the NI-VISA<sup>™</sup> Engine shall be installed. If this software is already installed, please proceed with the <u>installation of application software</u>.





Click "NI-VISA™ Engine". The National Instruments Installer starts.

#### 4.1.3 Install Device Drivers







## 5 Connect CS2010


Please make sure you have the instrument software installed (see section <u>Software Installation</u>) prior to connect hardware.

- Connect the handset to the CS2010 driver
- Connect power supply to AC power and to CS2010
- Switch on the UV curing system
- Connect the driver to the control PC using the USB2.0 cable.


The operating system will recognize the new hardware and starts searching a driver from Windows update. You may skip this search.



As a next step, the driver software will be installed to the operating system.



After finishing, please click "Close" to finish.




## 6 Graphic User Interface (GUI)

Start the remote software by clicking to the connect the software to your CS2010 UV curing system, click to the green "Connect" item:



A request to select the instrument will appear:



Select the instrument, then "Accept". The GUI (Graphic User Interface) activates. The display (1) of the CS2010 will show the same menu as selected in the software. The software reads out settings of the hardware and displays them. The following parameters and settings cannot be changed remotely:

- Brightness of the display (1)
- Safety mode
- · Beep interval and volume
- Power Mode (from software it's always "Toggle" see chapter <u>Settings</u>)


The function <u>Irradiance Mode</u> is not available via software.

## 6.1 Menu Bar

Select "Menu" to connect or disconnect the CS2010 and to exit the program:



Select Configuration to set user current limit:





#### Note

The numeric value for **Limit** (to the right) is the hardware limit, read out from the EEPROM in the handset and cannot be changed. Any lower limit can be entered to the box **Output**.





## 6.2 Continuous Mode


The software Continuous Mode is equivalent to the hardware Continuous Mode:



Set the desired Output intensity by either moving the slider or by entering a numeric value and control the LED by clicking to **Handset Output** button. Intensity change is possible with LED ON or OFF.

## 6.3 Timer Mode


The software Timer Mode is equivalent to hardware  $\underline{\mathsf{Timer\ Mode}}$ :




In the **Timer Mode** tab, the desired LED intensity and exposure time can be selected. Clicking to the **Handset Output** button starts / aborts the timer count down.

## 6.4 Configuration Mode

The tab Configuration Mode provides a more easy to handle tool to program up to 10 different pre-settings for intensity and exposure time.




Select a button from the row to the left, enter the desired name (max. to 12 characters, valid characters are numbers, upper and lower case letters), set intensity and exposure time, then click **Set** to save settings:



To operate the CS2010 with a configuration, just select it and click the **Handset Output** button to start/abort exposure.

## 6.5 Slope Mode

The tab Slope Mode in CS2010 software is equivalent to the topic Slope Mode of the driver.



Select the values for start and end intensity of the slope and the exposure time. The button **Handset Output** starts and terminates the exposure.

## 7 Maintenance and Service

Protect the CS2010 from adverse weather conditions. The CS2010 is not water resistant.



## 7.2 Troubleshooting

• After switching on, an error message as below appears:



- ⇒ Check if a hand set is properly connected. Switch the driver OFF and ON again.
- ⇒ If the error persists, please contact <u>Thorlabs</u> for advice
- During operation the error below appears:



- ⇒ The LED or the handset are defective. Please contact <u>Thorlabs</u> for return instructions.
- Over temperature protection



⇒ The CS2010 driver overheated during operation. Make sure that ventilation gaps (8) in the cabinet are not blocked.
